Drug: Yasmin (Drospirenone and Ethinyl Estradiol - Oral Contraceptive)

Brief Summary: Patient had been taking Yasmin for birth control as evident from medical and pharmacy records. She developed DVT (Deep Venous Thrombosis) in her right leg on 02/06/2007. Yasmin was discontinued per Dr. Braver's advice, on 02/08/2007 due to formation of blood clots. It is not evident from the records that her chest pain, foot edema, vision changes and headaches were related to Yasmin. Medical Literature strongly supports the formation of deep vein thrombosis by Yasmin.

		<p>Assessment: Deep vein thrombosis.</p> <p>Plan: Patient was admitted. Patient was prescribed Lovenox 1mg/kg IV twice a day, Coumadin 5mg orally everyday, Effexor 75mg 3 orally daily, Tylenol 650mg orally every 4 hours in the evening, Restoril 15-30mg orally every night at bedtime, levothyroxine 0.1mg orally everyday. Labs were ordered. Advair 250/50 twice a day was prescribed. Once INR was 2, patient was to be discharged home.</p>	
02/08/2007		<p>Patient had blood clot in right leg under knee cap reaching up to vaginal area. Patient had no more Yasmin so refilled Nortrel. She started taking Yasmin in January and had been using it till now for 1 month and 3 weeks. Dr. Braver (Primary Care Physician) was asked if patient should stop taking oral contraceptive Yasmin.</p> <p>Medications: Advair, Topamax, Levothyroxine, Nortriptyline, Imitrex, Yasmin/Nortrel, Valtrex (as needed)</p> <p>Plan: Patient needed to take blood thinners until blood count was low enough. Patient was told not to take any more oral contraceptive pills with hormones due to blood clot.</p>	23
11/07/2007	<p>Internal Medicine And Pediatrics</p> <p>Alyssa Zwarych, M.D.</p>	<p>Follow-up for hematology for DVT</p> <p>MD stated that the patient possibly no longer required Coumadin. Patient was interested in restarting oral contraceptives. Acne improved with Rosula. She was tolerating it ok. There was questionable redness at site where patient applied it. Migraines had increased since patient was taken off oral contraceptives. She was getting Botox.</p> <p>Physical examination: No abnormal findings.</p> <p>Assessment:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. History of DVT – repeat Doppler was negative. Follow-up with hematology recommendations including oral contraceptive pills. Continue Coumadin. 2. Acne- continue Rosula 3. Migraines- Follow-up with Neurology if Botox required. 4. Hypothyroidism- continue levothyroxine 	139

Brief Description of Injury:

Deep Vein Thrombosis on 02/06/2007. Patient was advised to discontinue Yasmin on 02/08/2007 due to formation of blood clots. Patient had edema and pain in her right leg. DVT subsequently resolved but patient continued to have lower extremity edema and pain for some time. Prothrombin time was high.
